Freshmen at York and former REACH students in Honors or AP courses. In the summer of 2020 they noticed a huge jump in the amount of independence and amount of work. Tuesday was created as a way to help them keep school work organized and it started as a spreadsheet and evolved from there.

Tuesday Technologies is a web based smart management tool. It uses a prioritization system and the Pomodoro technique (small blocks of time dedicated to a certain task)

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Jeffrey made a demonstration of the tool showing how to get things organized. Executive functioning skills can be trained and should be trained early, so this system is appropriate not only for high school students, but even for middle school.

## Leslie Weber - REACH program updates

- The identification process for 2nd and 5th grade is in full swing; they are collecting data from COGAT and MAP testing.
- COGAT results will be emailed by the end of next week (March 19, 2021)
- Identification will be announced by the end of March. Only qualified students will receive emails.
- The appeals process will start on April 5th for two weeks; it will close on April 16 at 5:00 PM firm deadline. The application for appeal is on the <u>website</u> (available in English and Spanish). Only parents can complete an appeal application for now (teachers and principals were able to do so in the past).
- The REACH identification rubrics have been updated on the website.
- April 5th webinar with Mrs. Weber to present the appeal process @7:00 PM
- Information to be shared in district and principals' newsletters
- The appeal process updated incorporates more information; most recent COGAT and MAP. Highest scores to be used. Students' grades are incorporated and building-based recommendations (teachers and principals).
- April 19 informational night board presentation for the community. Webinar format. The presentation is available under Board docs.
- Magnet program (3rd through 5th grade) for students that qualify for both ELA and MATH in the top 2%.
- Enriched program for ELA increase the time from currently 30 minutes to 60 minutes.
- MATH recommend single acceleration vs double acceleration. The opportunity for double acceleration will still be there.
- The magnet classes (2023) slow roll out
- Talent development for younger students (K-2) with teacher help (gradual rollout)
- Will train teachers with total school cluster grouping (following Dr. Gentry's ideas from Purdue University) with focus on social-emotional learning, executive functioning, differentiated instructions, personalized instruction.
- The magnet class will not replace REACH. It is an additional layer for the highest achievers (top 2%)
- Current 5th graders will follow current path for acceleration
- Each building will still have a REACH teacher

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- Students currently in REACH will stay in the current path, rollout will take a few years
- Not all schools will have magnet, only one school at the beginning
- Total school cluster grouping kids can be moved in different groups based on their academical needs.
- kids identified this year in 2nd grade will stay on the current program
